**March 10, 2017:** Jan Ochterbeck will be presenting her lecture on Cut and Shuffle Quilts. Jan has had a career in apparel, textile and accessory product development. **April 7, 2017: Lizzie B Cre8ive.** Liz Hawkins will be joining us. She's been a quilt designer in the industry, along with her sister-in-law, for almost 10 years. They started their journey as designers together because of their combined passion for quilting, and also because they both share the exact same name: Elizabeth Ann Hawkins! They always thought it'd be fun to go into business together. They started **Lizzie B Cre8ive** as pattern designers concentrating mostly on whimsical, bright, appliqué projects. They went on to publish two books with Kansas City Star. They also teach, lecture, and have just launched their 6th fabric line with Henry Glass Fabrics. It's been a wild ride, and they've made many friends along the way in this wonderful industry.

**May 12, 2017:** Candy Grisham will present her program "Discovering the artist within -- The Journey to Creativity." This lecture and trunk show will explore how to find the inner artist and where creativity comes from.

**Saturday, May 13:** *Candy will give a workshop, Modern Dresden.* A modern update for making a variety of Dresden plate designs using a single template. The class will cover 4 different variations of edge finishes. Size variations are endless. You will learn to sew the plates by machine and mix and match your edge finishes if desired. ## “The Power of Quilts” – Quilt Show 2017

The quilt show is less than a month away. The arrangement of the quilts has been decided and the vendor spaces are filled. Sleeves are being attached to over 225 quilts.

Thank you to all who have signed up to be volunteers. We have many sit down jobs (sewing machine raffle, membership table, book and pattern sales) that still need staffing. We also have need for white glove volunteers. Please look at the list available in this newsletter and see what jobs still need to be filled. Be prepared to sign up at the March 10<sup>th</sup> Guild meeting, which is only ONE WEEK BEFORE the quilt show. Consider signing up for more than one slot. If you have signed up for show setup or quilt hanging please double check the times, the time slots have been shifted slightly.

Quilt drop off is from 7:45 – 9:00 am at Queeny Park on Friday, March 17<sup>th</sup>. Please make arrangements to get your quilts there on time. Every quilt must be finished and bound, have a label on the back, and be stored in a pillowcase. Each pillowcase must be labeled with the guild member's name and quilt name. Sleeves must be attached to all quilts with a perimeter of 100 inches or more, which means every quilt, except a miniature, needs a sleeve. Look on the website for directions and measurements for putting on sleeves. When putting the quilts in the pillowcase please fold the quilts so that the sleeve is near the pillow top opening as well as the quilt label. This insures that the right quilt is hung in the correct location with a minimal chance of the quilt touching the floor.

We need ladders to help hang drapes and quilts on Friday. Please bring your 6 foot or taller ladders to help us make faster work of putting the show up. The ladders are stored out of sight for the weekend and then are brought back out for take down.

For the first time, lunch for volunteers and vendors will be available at the concession stand on Friday, 11 am–2 pm. There will be food available that is appropriate for those observing Lenten abstinence from meat.

Due to security concerns, guild members will not be able to store personal items in the money counting room. There will be tubs behind the door prize table to store small items. Since there will be no direct supervision of the tubs, members' use of

the tubs is at their own risk. Our recommendation is to bring as little as possible to the show, keeping cash and credit cards on your person.

### **Show Announcements**

**Touch of Spring Challenge** – Cindy Clifton advises that she only received 4 “Touch of Spring” quilts at the February meeting. She has asked the remaining 3 or so be brought to the March meeting including the peoples’ choice quilt. If you won a prize, please put a note on your quilt. All quilts must have a label on them so (1) you get proper recognition and (2) so that it comes back to you. They will be returned to you at the April meeting.

**Quilt Raffle** – please bring in sold tickets and monies for the raffle quilt and give to Cindy Clifton. We, the Guild, need to determine the status of sales and how much money we have actually collected.

**Four Seasons Challenge** – your challenge piece is due at the March meeting; please turn in to Dolores Keaton. A quick reminder about the rules: the finished size is 6” by 36” long using any technique(s). Edges are to be finished either with a binding or pillowcase technique. It must be quilted. Make sure your name is on the back. One specific color is to be included for each season along with any additional colors you choose to include: Spring – Lime Green, Summer – Yellow, Autumn – Orange, and Winter – Teal Green.

**Hot Hexie Challenge** – Due no later than the March Meeting (3/10/17). Guidelines are on the website under Downloads – Quilt Show Challenge. Basic guidelines are: (1) only hexagons may be used in the quilt (although pieced hexies will work), (2) size of hexagon is your choice, (3) color scheme is your choice, (4) quilt parameters – no larger than 25” by 25”, and (5) quilt must be labeled on back and include name of quilt, quilt maker, quilter, and contact information of owner.
