A Tip From Russ Horne:

How to determine the size needed for a continuous binding square.

1. Determine the total inches around the outside edge of the quilt.
2. Multiply the answer in step 1 by the width of your desired binding strip.
3. Determine the square root of the answer in step 2 and round up to a whole number.
4. Add 2 inches to the answer in step 3; this will be the size square needed for your quilt.

This will give you a little extra for corners and finishing.
