The movie showcased a 120-ft long quilt containing blocks representative of all immigrant nationalities to Canada as well as Canada's First Nations. 150 different images were included in the quilt. The quilt is outstanding and inspiring and just plain awesome.

Committee reports:

Newsletter – Susan Sanders advised the next deadline is March 24, 2020

Membership – Lillian Seese reported 26 members and 1 guest in attendance

Fabric raffle – Anne Hennig showed the fabric collections for raffle – one consisting of 4 garden panels with coordinated fabric and one panel with additional yardage. She also had a pack of 4-inch squares of Civil War reproduction fabric for anyone who wanted it.

Comfort Quilts – Karen Puricelli announced that batting is available for both the long-twin quilts needed for the teenagers and also for Sweet Babies. Please contact her to obtain batting.

Break – a 15 minute break was taken

Business – Denise Poepsel presented the slate of officers as published in the March newsletter: President – Debby Logan, Secretary – Gay Stewart, and Co-Treasurers – Adele Niblack and Ruth Grimes. No nominations were made from the floor. A motion was made and seconded to approve the slate of officers by unanimous declaration. Denise also announced that Anita Brinkman had agreed to be Vice-President for the next year; a vote could not be taken on the Vice-President position as notice had not been given to the membership. A vote will be taken at the April meeting.

April Program – the April program with Paul Leger has been cancelled due to travel restrictions resulting from the coronavirus.

Cindy Bell Neville reported that the St. Louis Totem quilts would be traveling to Paducah, KY to be exhibited.

Fabric raffle and membership raffle were held followed by Show and Tell (15 items shown).

Each block gets made individually, put on the design wall, and then the next block's colors are figured out. Takes more time to figure out the color scheme than to paper piece the block.

COMFORT QUILT OPPORTUNITIES

During our time of uncertainty, I would like to ask our membership to think about the ways they can find peace and comfort through helping others. Our outreach is even more important now than it was before Covid19 became an issue. We still have babies being born! In addition, there are still young people who will hopefully be going off to college this fall, and there may be even more people in need for the services offered at Home Sweet Home. The guidelines are as follow:

1. Sweet Babies—any baby quilt will be welcomed! They would like to receive quilts that incorporate a black and white theme, but please don't let that stop you from using colors that may be more appealing to you. The preferred size is 40" X 50", but smaller quilts make awesome car seat/stroller/tummy time gifts!
2. College Quilts—we are hoping to still be able to gift these. The current need is 25, and I have 8 currently. The preferred size is 56" X 88".
3. Home Sweet Home—they enjoy receiving quilts of about 50" x 60" or larger. The target population for these are adults, some with children. My plan will be to donate any quilts earmarked for the college quilt outreach that aren't needed. We had some college quilt overage last fall, and those were gratefully accepted and given to families with school aged children to help start their school year off with something new and to adults who were starting their housekeeping with twin-sized beds.

I have batting that might help you in finishing these projects stored at my home. It is cut into usable-size pieces and stored in plastic (a huge thank you to Jan and DeWayne Carron for doing this for us!). I can take a page from Charity Sharity's book and place them on my porch for you if you give me your specific requests and the time that you would be passing by my house. The batting is cut into 50" X 60" pieces for the baby quilts and 120" X 70" for the college quilts.
