Happy August, the last month of summer, primary voting and school starting soon! Our Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild meeting is **Friday**, **August 12**, **2022** at Shrewsbury Community Center. Our program will be a "ZOOM" meeting with Lorraine Torrance, plus a "Sale" to benefit the Guild from Patty Thompson and Kathy Sherrick. We will NOT have a Free Table or Fabric Raffle that evening, but bring your checkbook to buy up their overstock of treasures. The sale will be before our meeting and during the break.

Our July Demo Program from 4 members gave us enough information and inspiration to try something new. After attending each session by **Ruth Grimes**, **Cindy Bell Neville**, **Adele Niblack and Russ Horne**, we can appreciate all the preparation and samples they had, and how to cram all that knowledge into a 20 minute class was impressive. They all had samples for us to see while they worked away at ongoing projects. Several tips were given: Cindy had a Teflon Appliqué Sheet to save iron from glue substances when appliquéing, Ruth said the best buy for roping was at Big Lots, Russ starts thread with a French knot and who knew you could buy 100 sticks of glue and put in the refrigerator, and Adele uses a Supreme Slider sheet on top of sewing arm to make fabric glide easier. Thank you all for all the time you gave to making samples, notes, bringing in all your sewing machines and samples to share your expertise.

We have had several new members join in the last few months and I requested that they make a handmade name tag to help all of us get to know one another sooner, that also goes for all members, let's wear our name tags.

Our NEW Website is up and running and I hope everyone checks it out to see the information that others are seeing about Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild. It is new and fresh and up-to-date with ongoing and future programs, Ricky Tims in September and annual Retreat in October.

August Program - Lorraine Torrence Award Winning Quilter Will Relate the story of Contemporary Japanese Quiltmaking

Have you ever wondered how quiltmaking in Japan differs from our quilt scene and why so many Japanese quiltmakers are landing so many top prizes in American Quilt Shows? In our August 12 program you will see some examples of the quilt artistry of several top Japanese quilters and how their trajectory to stardom differs from those in this country. You will also see the work

of some "rogue" Japanese quilt artists who work in a different sphere. "All in all, the quilters in Japan display a mastery of discipline, consistency and hard work that exemplifies these same qualities in Japanese culture as a whole, " according to our speaker, Lorraine Torrence.

Ms. Torrence is a wearable art maker and quiltmaker living and working in Madison, Wisconsin. With a Master of Fine Arts degree from the University of Washington, she draws upon lessons in color, composition, line and space to create wearable and wall textile art using the quiltmaker's techniques of piecing, appliqué and quilting. She has been teaching quiltmaking, design and creative clothing since 1972, and traveled throughout he US and Canada, teaching for Guilds and Conferences until 2017. Now she lectures on Zoom and for nearby shops and groups in Wisconsin.

She has written three books on quilting and design and has been a judge, teacher and award winning exhibitor in many AQS shows.

This lecture will be via Zoom in our regular meeting room at the Shrewsbury City Center.



SPECIAL STASH BUSTER SALE TO BENEFIT THIMBLE & THREAD



Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes

July 8, 2022

The July meeting was opened at 7pm by President Denise Poepsel.

Tonight's program featured four of our members demonstrating four techniques and products they enjoyed:

- Russ Horne demonstrated his unique method of hand appliqué using paper templates for the pieces of appliqué that are then layered and sewn as a unit.
- Ruth Grimes showed us how to make festive fabric bowls using only clothesline, narrow fabric strips and a zigzag stitch.
- Cindy Neville gave us three ways of doing machine appliqué using stabilizers, fusibles and various machine stitches.
- Adele Niblack taught us how using acrylic templates gives a professional look to our quilting.

All of our talented presenters included takeaways to help ensure success with the projects including favorite products and tips and a few things not to do!

Reservations are being taken for the January 21st, 2023 workshop at Jackman's featuring textile artist Jane Unger teaching us how to paint on fabric. Cost is \$30.

Susan Sanders gave her report on the upcoming retreat on Oct. 28 - 30th The cost is \$30 per person.

Lea Ann Huckaby reminded us that featured speaker Ricky Tim's presentation on September 9th will be limited to 200 attendees. Cost to non- members is \$15, free to paid members and will use a list rather than tickets for admission. If you haven't done so be sure to get your name on the list!
