The next meeting of Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild of Greater St. Louis will be June 9, 2023 with member Giselle Rucker giving the program this month.

Our May 12th meeting welcomed back Suzanne Marshall - her PowerPoint presentation started from her early days of quilt making to present colorful, vibrant appliqué, hand-quilted award winning quilts. She read some of the positive and negative reviews received from judges on her quilts, which at times were so opposite in their critiques you questioned if they were looking at the same quilt. She shared many of her works in person for us to touch. Suzanne referenced a British magazine "HALI" for a lot of her inspirations for her quilts. After explaining the work in her "Mastectomy" quilt she quoted, "A changed body is not important, but enjoying life is". Catch her with Ricky Tims on You-Tube, THE QUILT SHOW, from 2-1-2023. Her son Chris ran the projector for her and helped in the sale of books and patterns she brought along. He was also nice enough to also hold quilts during our Show and Tell time. Suzanne gave a workshop next day on hand appliqué and hope that we get to see some results at the June Show and Tell from those that attended. As I told Suzanne I didn't

remember from her past talks that she was so funny, it seemed she had us in 'stitches' quite a lot during her talk.

Thimble and Thread member Giselle Rucker will be our June 2023 speaker with a program all about African Mud Cloth and Bogolan Fabric.

Mud cloth is a traditional Malian fabric that is dyed with fermented mud and plant dyes. With very ornate patterns, this process can take four days to a week to make depending on humidity and rain.

Mud cloth is used today in quilts, garments and home dec designs. Giselle will have many samples to pass around and a slide show about the process of making mud cloth and how it is used today in a variety of projects.

Minutes of the Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild May 12, 2023

President Denise Poepsel opened the meeting at 7 pm. Vice President Adele Niblack introduced the night's speaker, St. Louis native quilter, Suzanne Marshall. Suzanne is an international, award-winning quilter, who taught herself to quilt and uses her own quilting technique, one which does not use a frame or a hoop. Her specialty is applique' and her favorite themes depict folk art, nature and images from ancient times, brought to life with fabric, needle and thread. Her international awards include quilts shown at Osaka and Tokyo, Japan plus The Hague, The Netherlands. Her national awards include one of the" Twentieth Century's 100 Best American Quilts." She has also won several awards at the International

Quilt Festival in Houston, as well as numerous awards around the country. Two of her quilts, "Toujour Nouveau" and "Mother's Day", are in the permanent collection of the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky. Suzanne gave a trunk show of many of her works and answered questions from the group, including that she likes to use Polydown by Hobbs for her batting and to match the grainline of her applique', piece to the grainline of the background. She will also be giving a workshop on her applique' technique tomorrow, May 13th, here at the Shrewsbury City Center.

Committee Reports:
